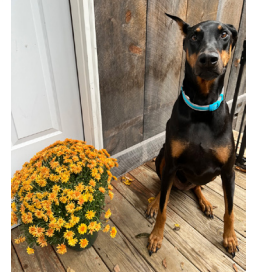
He doesn't understand furniture is for dogs too, yet, but hopefully in time, he'll realize the couches and bed are for him as well!

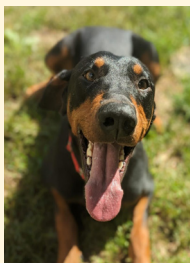

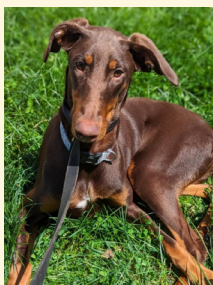
This handsome and regal Doberman has had his share of experiences, and he's ready to embark on a new adventure with a loving person. Here's what you need to know about Poseidon:

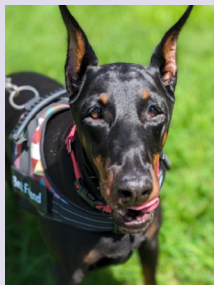

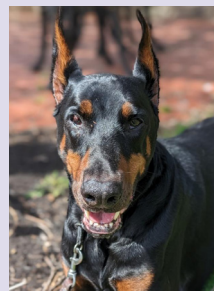
